UTAH BALLROOM EDUCATORS ASSOCIATION RULES AND REGULATIONS

The UBEA State Title match is not an NDCA Competition. However we will abide by rules and regulations governing competitions and championships recognized by the National Dance Council of America, Inc. Some of the NDCA rules that directly apply to amateur competitors, along with additional rules applied by the organizer follow:

1. ALL COMPETITORS AND SPECTATORS must purchase an admission ticket for each day they are attending.

2. No couple is exempt from competing in any round. Any couple who fails to appear at the scheduled time for the first round of any event will be disqualified from the event.

3. No person may compete in an age classification lower than their own. A couple's age classification eligibility is defined as the age that they will be **during the competition,** however, this definition does not allow the younger member of the partnership to dance up two age levels. Specifics are listed below:

Age Category Classifications

<u>Pre-Teen 1.</u> Competitors who are 9 years old and younger. "Pre-Teen 1" competitors may dance up one age classification to the "Pre-Teen 2" category, but only as defined in entry restrictions below. A Pre-Teen 1 competitor may not dance in the Junior age categories.

<u>Pre-Teen 2.</u> Competitors who are 10-11 years old. "Pre-Teen 2 competitors may dance up one age classification to the "Junior 1" category, but only as defined in the entry restrictions below. A Pre-Teen 2 competitor may not dance in the Junior 2 and above age categories.

Junior 1. Competitors who are 12-13 years old. "Junior 1" competitors may dance up one age classification to the "Junior 2" age category, but only as defined in the entry restrictions below. A Junior 1 competitor may not dance in the Youth or Adult age categories even if partnered by a Youth. Junior 2. Competitors who are 14-15 years old. "Junior 2" competitors may dance up one age classification to the "Youth" age category, but only as defined in the entry restrictions below. A Junior 2 competitors may dance up one age classification to the "Youth" age category, but only as defined in the entry restrictions below. A Junior 2 competitor may not dance in the Adult age categories.

Youth. Competitors who are 16, 17 or 18 years old. Nineteen (19) year olds may also dance as youths until they have graduated from "High School". "Youth" competitors may concurrently dance up one age classification into the "Adult" category, but only as defined in entry restrictions below.

Entry Restrictions

1. Pre-teen 1 and 2, Junior 1 and 2 and Youth competitors who dance a Championship or Open event may not dance in the Syllabus event of the same style.

2. Pre-Teens 1 and 2 & Juniors 1 and 2 may dance up ONE division only in each competition category.

3. All competitors may dance a maximum of two events in each competition category or style ie: "Youths" may dance two of the following four events in each category: "Youth", "Novice", "Pre-Championship" and "Championship". Additionally couples who enter the youth "Newcomer" and "Syllabus" event may not enter any adult event in that same style. *This is a BYU rule.*

4. Open competitors are not allowed to compete Newcomer or Syllabus events of the same style. Likewise, Newcomer competitors may not compete in any Open event.

5. Any amateur competitor who wears a costume deemed by the organizers to be unsuitable will be requested to change. If such request is not followed, the competitor will not be allowed to dance and their entry will be canceled. Specific costume rules are listed below.

6. Competitors in the Latin-American divisions must not be overly suggestive in their movements at all times while on the floor. Couples who have movements that are viewed as inappropriate will be warned once, and then will be subject to disqualification.

Syllabus Dress Restrictions

BOYS:

TROUSERS: a) Black only b) High waist optional c) Underfoot strap optional d) Satin stripes are allowed SHIRTS: a) Plain white long sleeved collared shirt only b) No pleats or ribbing c) Sleeves to be worn at wrist length MATERIALS: a) Fabrics must be plain, ie: cotton, polyester, cotton/polyester blend, wool blend b) No shiny fabrics c) No glitter, metallic thread, patterns or sequins allowed d) Decorations - not allowed VESTS: a) Sweaters and vests NOT allowed. TIE: a) Black color only, may be either straight or bow.

SOCKS: a) Black only.

SHOES: No restrictions

MAKEUP: Not allowed.

HAIRSTYLE: Long hair must be worn in a pony tail.

GIRLS:

Skirt with top or simple dress with attached under garment or leotard top with full skirt

SKIRTS: a) Plain or pleated with minimum 1 to maximum 3 half circles. One simple underskirt allowed which is no larger or longer than top layer b) No use of boning, frills, splits, openings, fishing line, etc c) Length of skirt must be at least knee length.

NECKLINES: a) Boat, high neck, v-neck, sweetheart, 'peter pan' collar, scoop and regular collar are allowed.

SLEEVES: are required a) Long, short, elbow length, cap, or puff are allowed b) cannot be replaced by trimmings, frills, or edging on the shoulder line. c) No "finger loops" allowed

MATERIALS: a) Fabrics *MUST* be only one color throughout. b) No glitter, metallic thread, or fabric creating 'light or pattern effects'. c) No use of feathers, fringes, bows, belts, frills or sequins d) No flesh color fabric e) Any use of color coordinated 'see through' fabric must be lined from waist to shoulder; for use on arms no lining is needed.

SHOES: No restrictions. MUST HAVE HEEL GUARDS!

SOCKS: a) White ankle socks or hose or fishnet tights.

OTHER: a) No use of arm bands, chokers or headbands. b) No decoration is allowed on dress or in hair. c) No jewelry is allowed other than one small earring in each ear. d) basic makeup allowed for elementary girls. e) Competition make up is allowed for Junior High and High School girls.

Pre-Teen 1 and 2 Championship Couples (Ballroom, Latin & American Style):

Men: Same as Syllabus costume restrictions above, however, men may substitute a black shirt or dark blue pants or dark blue socks.

Ladies: Same as Syllabus costume restrictions above, however, Ladies' dresses must be made of fabric only one color throughout. Must have block heel style not to exceed 1.5 inches in height. NO FISHNETS! NO MAKE UP!

Pre-Teen 2 competitors who dance up to Junior categories must remain in the approved Pre-Teen costumes.

Junior & Youth Championship Couples (Ballroom, Latin & American Style):

Junior and Youth Championship Couples may wear the attire specified for Junior & Youth Newcomer/Syllabus Couples or attire specified for the Adult Couples. Heel guards must be worn at all times.

Adult Couples (Ballroom, Latin, Novice, Pre-Championship and Championship):

Men: Costumes appropriate to the style.

1. Adult and Youth Latin shirts may be open to a point eight inches down from the Supra Sternal Notch (Jugular Notch). Junior and Pre-teen Latin shirts may be open down to the sternum.

2. Sheer fabric may only be worn on the arm. No sleeveless shirts.

3. No earrings.

Women: Costumes appropriate to the style.

1. Regular cut dance trunks and fishnet hose must be worn.

2. Straps over both shoulders of at least one inch in width are required. If multiple straps go over a shoulder at least one strap must be the required one -inch wide from front to back. Halter-tops or designs that resemble them are not permitted.

3. Lower backs must be covered from a point five (5) inches above the waistline.

4. Sheer fabric on the bodice may be used from the top of the bust line up, in front, and in the back, from five inches above the waist up, in this case straps are not required.

5. Skirts may be broken or slitted from the trunk line down, but must cover the legs to mid-thigh when not in motion.

6. Skin from the front to a point several inches behind the sides (axilla-line) must be covered.

7. Cutouts or nude fabrics are not allowed.

8. Unitards are not allowed

9. Heel guards are mandatory and must be worn at all times, no exceptions.

COSTUMES AND HEELGUARDS WILL BE CHECKED THROUGHOUT THE COMPETITION. INFRINGEMENTS OF THE RULES WILL BE GIVEN A WARNING AND ASKED TO CORRECT THE PROBLEM. IF IT IS NOT RESOLVED BY THE NEXT ROUND, ORGANIZERS RESERVE THE RIGHT TO DISQUALIFY A COMPETITOR.
